COLONOSCOPY PREPARATION GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS



You must arrive 1 hour before your scheduled time.

You cannot drive yourself home from the procedure. You must bring a responsible adult - 18 years or older, with you to drive you home and sign discharge paperwork. Taxi, bus, Uber, Lyft, or any rideshare service cannot be used as transportation.

Instructions:

Diet:

- 1. For the full day prior to your procedure, you can only eat clear liquids. You cannot eat solid food or soft foods. Clear liquid foods include Gatorade, Powerade, clear broth, Jello, popsicles, clear fruit juices, coffee, tea, and clear Ensure.
- 2. **Do not eat, drink, or put any substance in your mouth for 4 hours prior to your procedure.** This includes chewing gum, hard candy, and tobacco products. You must complete the last dose of your bowel preparation 4 hours before your procedure.
- 3. You should not eat nuts or seeds for 1 week prior to your procedure.
- 4. Eat a low-fiber diet for 1 week prior to your procedure.
- 5. Stop iron supplements 1 week prior to your procedure.

Medications:

- 1. You may take your usual medications with a sip of water 4 hours prior to the procedure unless instructed not to take a medication.
- 2. You may continue to take aspirin and anti-inflammatory medications such as Aleve, Advil, Motrin, ibuprofen, and naproxen.
- 3. You must stop taking any injectable GLP-1 medications used to treat diabetes and weight loss one week prior to your procedure. These include Trulicity, Byetta, Ozempic, Mounjaro, Victoza, and lixisenatide.
- 4. If you are on diabetic medications, please contact your prescribing physicians for dosing changes since you will be on a clear liquid diet and will not be eating for 12 hours prior to your procedure.
- 5. Please contact the office to be advised on **stopping your blood thinners** prior to your procedure. Our number is (330) 926-3313.

Activity:

- 1. You cannot work the entire day of the procedure. You may return to work the following day.
- 2. You cannot drive a car, operate machinery including lawn equipment, sign legal documents, or engage in any activity that requires mental alertness and good judgment for the entire day after your procedure.
